The Magic Yarn Project



On February 26, twelve RTOERO members from the London-Middlesex area took part in a Magic Yarn workshop. The Magic Yarn Project creates buttery soft wigs for children experiencing medical hair loss from chemotherapy, alopecia, trichotillomania, burns, and more. Our area is fortunate to have the only Canadian Magic Yarn Chapter meeting monthly to create these magical wigs at the Dorchester Community Centre under the leadership of Chapter Leader Sue Beringer.



Sue has been working at creating Magic Yarn wigs and hats with a growing group of volunteers from the London-Middlesex area since 2020. That first year, 38 wigs and 19 hats were sent to cancer support groups in Toronto and Mississauga. The Magic Yarn Project (London Chapter) currently provides wigs and hats to hospital and cancer support groups in Toronto, Mississauga, Hamilton, London, Waterloo, Scarborough and Ottawa. The goal is for a projected total of 330 wigs and 440 hats in 2024.

At the February workshop, Sue guided a dozen RTOERO members through one of the many steps required to start the creation of 14 Elsa and Jasmine wigs in just two hours. The next step in the process will be the "bedazzling" of the wigs with jewels and ribbons.
